Did you know these search tips?

1. Where case catchwords exist search them as follows:
Use AustLII's proximity operator with the term "catchwords". For example:
catchwords w/10 negligence
catchwords w/15 mistake

AustLII toolbar



Once installed, the AustLII toolbar allows you to search AustLII from any website.

The toolbar includes the AustLII menu which lists links for most of the major category materials for all Australian jurisdictions and New Zealand. For example, you can select the jurisdiction, such as NSW and then select the specific databases which you would like to browse. You can also search on specific databases using the Advanced Search option.

The search box enables you to search across AustLII's databases. Its drop down feature enables you to see your last few searches. Use the Clear Search History under the Settings menu to delete your search history.

Under the Settings menu, once you have entered your search text you can select search options and choose to search:

- any of these words
- all of these words
- autosearch
- this phrase
- this document title
- this Boolean query

The buttons on the AustLII toolbar for other Legal Information Institutes may also be customised (selectively shown/hidden) from the Settings menu by clicking/unclicking on the buttons.

The AustLII toolbar has been updated for Mozilla Firefox (versions 4, 5 and 6) and SeaMonkey Suite web browsers.

The Liberia Legal Information Institute is a new addition to the LII family. AustLII developed LiberLII with funding from the American Bar Association's Rule of Law Initiative (ABA ROLI) supported by USAID. Liberia suffered war and instability during 1990-2003, leaving its legal infrastructure in tatters. LiberLII helps restore access to law.

One of the current Liberian government's priorities is good

governance and the rule of law. In 2010, the Liberian Minister of Justice entered into discussions with the American Bar Association to discuss the creation of an online library providing free-access to Liberia's laws. The LII model was adopted and AustLII was invited to develop LiberLII.

On 15 September 2011 LiberLII was launched. LiberLII operates as a not-for-profit organisation.

Initial databases on LiberLII include:

- Constitutions, Codes, Bills
- Supreme Court decisions
- Rules of Court
- Liberian Law Journal
